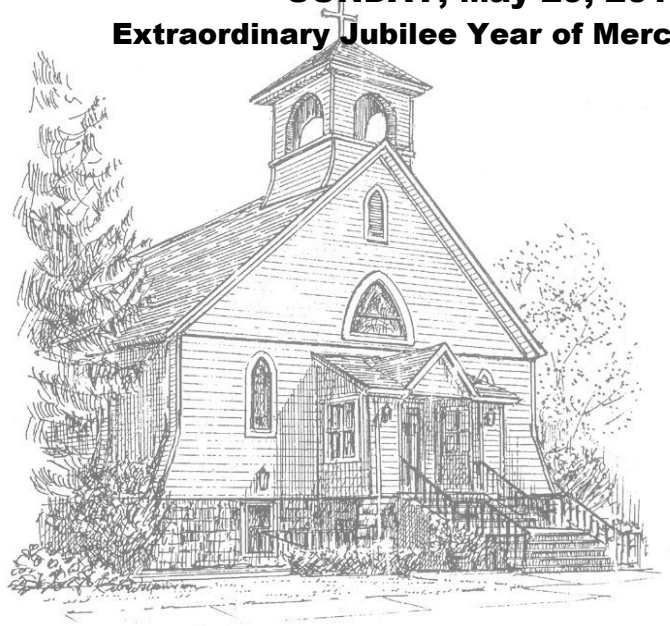

MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. There are many stories as to its actual beginnings, with over two dozen cities and towns laying claim to being the birthplace of Memorial Day. There is also evidence that organized woman's groups in the South were decorating graves before the end of the Civil War. While Waterloo, N.Y. was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May of 1966, it's difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the day. It is more likely that it had many separate beginnings; each of those towns, and every planned or spontaneous gathering of people to honor the war dead in the 1860's, tapped into the general human need to honor our dead. It is not important who is the very first; what is important is that Memorial Day was established. Memorial Day is not about division. It is about reconciliation; it is about coming together to honor those who gave their all. Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on May 5, 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic in his General Order No. 11, and was first observed on May 30, 1868 when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. The first State to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890, it was recognized by all of the northern States. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war). It is now celebrated in almost every State on the last Monday in May (passed by Congress with the National Holiday Act of 1971 (P.L. 90 – 363) to ensure a three day weekend for Federal Holidays), though several southern States have an additional separate day for honoring the Confederate war dead. We would like to extend our Memorial Day greetings to all the families whose loved ones served their country and for all the families that are so grateful to them for their courage in helping to keep America free.

Memorial Day is a day to remember those men and women who sacrificed their lives for defense of our country. As we pause to pray for them, let us also pray for lasting peace.

MEMORIAL DAY TRIBUTE & REFLECTION

Each Memorial Day, we honor those Americans who died while defending our Nation and its values. While these men and women should be honored every day for their profound contribution to securing our Nation's freedom, they and their families should be especially honored on Memorial Day. We in this country owe a debt of gratitude to those who sacrificed their lives so that we could live free. We can start to pay that debt by not forgetting, by remembering what they did and for what they stood.

For decades, Memorial Day was a day in our nation when stores closed and communities gathered together for a day of parades and other celebrations with a patriotic theme. Memorial Day meant ceremonies at cemeteries around the country, speeches honoring those who gave their lives, the laying of wreaths, the playing of Taps. In some places, these ceremonies continue. We should remember that on Memorial Day we honor the ideals and values for which those soldiers stood, and died defending. While you may not believe their cause was just, they were dedicated and courageous just the same.

As Saint Augustine was credited for saying over 1,600 years ago – **"The purpose of all war...is peace."** Let us pray that all leaders abide by this until war is no longer waged.

Sadly, many Americans have lost the connection with their history. For a growing percentage of the American people, Memorial Day has come to mean simply a three-day weekend or a major shopping day. Families might still gather for picnics, but for many of them, the patriotic core – the spirit of remembrance – is absent.

The "Memorial" in Memorial Day has been ignored by too many of us who are beneficiaries of those who have given the ultimate sacrifice. Often, we do not observe the day as it should be; a day where we actively remember our ancestors, our family members, our loved ones, our neighbors and our friends who have given the ultimate sacrifice.

We can observe this day by:

- Visiting cemeteries and placing flags or flowers on the graves of our fallen heroes.
- Visiting memorials.
- Flying the U.S. flag at half-staff until Noon.
- Flying the "POW/MIA Flag" as well (Section 1082 of the 1998 Defense Authorization Act).
- Participating in a "National Moment of Remembrance".
- Renewing a pledge to aid the widows, widowers, and orphans of our fallen dead, and to aid the disabled veterans.

Former President George W. Bush stated *"that on this day, we must tell the stories of those who fought and died in freedom's cause. We must tell their stories because those who've lost loved ones need to know that a grateful Nation will always remember. We must tell their stories so that our children and grandchildren will understand what our lives might have been like had it not been for their sacrifice."*

So, let us remember the cause for which these Americans fought and the freedom and peace bought with their life's blood, and let us pass along to a new generation the accounts of honor and courage. Democracy is not our creation; it is our inheritance and it is ours to pass along.

Charles M. Province, U.S. Army wrote:

- "It is the Soldier, not the minister who has given us freedom of religion.
- It is the Soldier, not the reporter who has given us freedom of the press.
- It is the Soldier, not the poet who has given us freedom of speech.
- It is the Soldier, not the campus organizer who has given us freedom to protest.
- It is the Soldier, not the lawyer who has given us the right to a fair trial.
- It is the Soldier, not the politician who has given us the right to vote.
- It is the Soldier who salutes the flag, who serves beneath the flag, And whose coffin is draped by the flag, who allows the protester to burn the flag."

Dear God, I have a problem, it's Me.

OUR ENEMIES

Our enemies are demons. Fallen angels. Evil spirits. So says Jesus Christ: "Do not fear those who can kill the body and then has no more power over you. I will tell you whom to fear. Fear him who has power to destroy both body and soul in Hell."

So says St. Peter, the first pope: "The Devil, like a roaring lion, is going through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Resist him, steadfast in the faith." So says St. Paul: "We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers of wickedness in high places." So said Pope Leo the XIII, who received a vision of the 20th century that history has proved terrifyingly true. He saw Satan, at the beginning of time, allowed one century in which to do his worst work, and he chose the 20th. This pope with the name and heart of a lion was so overcome by the terror of this vision that he fell into a trance. When he awoke, he composed a prayer (see below) for the whole Church to use to get it through the 20th century. The prayer was widely known and prayed after every Mass—until the '60s: exactly when the Church was struck with that incomparably swift disaster that we have not yet named (but which future historians will), the disaster that has destroyed a third of our priests, two-thirds of our nuns, and nine-tenths of our children's theological knowledge; the disaster that has turned the faith of our fathers into the doubts of our dissenters, the wine of the Gospel into the water of psychobabble.

Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host—by the Divine Power of God—cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

The restoration of the Church, and thus the world, might well begin with the restoration of the Lion's prayer and the Lion's vision, because this is the vision of all the popes and all the saints and our Lord himself: the vision of a real Hell, a real Satan, and real spiritual warfare. I said there were two enemies. The second is even more terrifying than the first. There is one nightmare even more terrible than being chased and caught and tortured by the Devil. That is the nightmare of becoming a devil. The horror outside your soul is terrible enough; how can you bear to face the horror inside your soul? What is the horror inside your soul? Sin. All sin is the Devil's work, though he usually uses the flesh and the world as his instruments. Sin means inviting the Devil in. And we do it. That's the only reason why he can do his awful work; God won't let him do it without our free consent. And that's why the Church is weak and the world is dying: because we are not saints.
