THE PRESENCE OF GOD

"The first means to acquire the Presence of God is great purity of life. The second is great fidelity to the practice of this presence. We must foster an awareness of God within, which must always be performed gently, humbly, and lovingly, without giving in to any disturbance or anxiety. Practice of Inner Awareness - We must take special care that this inner awareness, no matter how brief it may be, precedes our activities, that it accompanies them from time to time, and that we finish them in the same way."

INTERIOR LIFE

"Whenever our interior life becomes caught up in its own interests and concerns," Pope Francis wrote, "there is no longer room for others, no place for the poor. God's voice is no longer heard, the quiet joy of His love no longer felt, and the desire to do good fades." Among the reasons why Father Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus was to help Catholic men practice the faith and thus become better husbands and fathers. He made it a requirement that every Knight be a "practical Catholic," yet wisely did not demand that a man be a perfect Catholic to enter the Order. Rather, membership in the Knights is meant to help men progress in making God the first priority in their lives. Father McGivney knew that men would have a greater opportunity to put God first if they engaged in works of charity and experienced fraternity with other men who are striving to take their faith seriously. Making God a priority, in turn, would help them to find the inner strength to love the Church and their families more deeply.

The original vision of the Knights of Columbus is perhaps even more important today, amid a culture that is far more hostile to faith than it was in the late 19th century. Father McGivney was deeply in love with God, and he would want the same for Knights and their families. But more than that, he would want us to know that God has made us - each human being and the entire human race - his top priority. God loves each of us infinitely. He sent us his Son to save us from our sins. We love because God loved us first and He loves us best.

WHAT EINSTEIN SAID

"Being a lover of freedom, when the Nazi revolution came in Germany, I looked to the universities to defend it, but the universities were immediately silenced. Then I looked to the great editors of the newspapers, but they, like the universities, were silenced in a few short weeks. Only the Catholic Church stood squarely across the path of Hitler's campaign for suppressing the truth," Einstein said. With breath-taking honesty, Einstein admitted that he had changed his mind about the Catholic Church. He said, "[N]ow I feel great affection and admiration." Indeed, he said that he was "forced to confess that what I once despised, I now praise unreservedly."

SICKNESS & FAITH

by Pope Benedict XVI

Sickness inevitably brings with it, a moment of crisis and sober confrontation with one's own personal situation. Despite the advances of science, a cure cannot be found for every illness, and thus, in hospitals, hospices, and homes throughout the world, we encounter the sufferings of many of our brothers and sisters who are incurably, and often terminally, ill. I would like to encourage the efforts of those who work daily to ensure that the incurably and terminally ill, together with their families, receive adequate and loving care.

Role Of The Church

The Church, following the example of the Good Samaritan, has always shown particular concern for the infirm. Through Her individual members and institutions, She continues to stand alongside the suffering and attend the dying, striving to preserve their dignity at these significant moments of human existence. I now turn to you, my dear brothers and sisters suffering from incurable and terminal diseases. I encourage you to contemplate the sufferings of Christ crucified, and, in union with Him, to turn to the Father with complete trust that all life, and your lives in particular, are in His hands. Trust that your sufferings, united to those of Christ, will prove fruitful for the needs of the Church and the world. I ask the Lord to strengthen your faith in His love, especially during these trials that you are experiencing. It is my hope that, wherever you are, you will always find the spiritual encouragement and strength needed to nourish your faith, and bring you closer to the Father of Life.

A PRAYER FOR HEALING

Lord, You invite all who are burdened to come to You. Allow Your healing hand to heal me. Touch my soul with Your compassion for others. Touch my heart with Your courage and infinite love for all. Touch my mind with Your wisdom, that my mouth may always proclaim Your praise. Teach me to reach out to You in my need, and help me to lead others to You by my example. Most loving Heart of Jesus, bring me health in body and spirit that I may serve You with all my strength. Touch gently this life which You have created, now and forever. Amen.
