September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows

100th Anniversary of Fatima—What Happened The Lady Who Came From Heaven!

May 13, 1917 Apparition On May 13, the three little children took their flocks out to pasture in the area known as the Cova da Iria. After lunch and the Rosary, they suddenly saw a bright flash of light, followed quickly by another flash in the clear blue sky. They looked up to see. Lucia's description: "A Lady, clothed in white, brighter than the sun, radiating a light more clear and intense than a crystal cup filled with sparkling water lit by burning sunlight." The children stood there amazed, bathed in the light that surrounded the apparition. The Lady smiled and said, "Do not be afraid, I will not harm you. I come from heaven". She asked them to come to the Cova for six months on the 13th day at the same hour. Later she would tell them who she was. Then the lady said: "Are you willing to offer yourselves to God and bear all the sufferings He wills to send you as an act of reparation for the conversion of sinners?" Lucia replied for all three, "Yes, we are willing". "Then you are going to have much to suffer, but the grace of God will be your comfort." When she said these words, the Lady opened her hands and streamed a "light so intense that its rays penetrated our hearts and innermost souls, making us see ourselves in God." The children fell to their knees repeating, O most Holy Trinity, I adore you, my God, my God, I love in the most Holy sacrament." She ended the visit, "Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world and the end of war," and began to rise serenely towards the east until she disappeared.

June 13, 1917 Apparition As the children came to the Cova on June 13, about 50 people assembled with them near the holm oak tree. The children saw a flash of light followed immediately by the apparition of the Lady; she addressed Lucia, "I want you to come on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want." Lucia then asked the lady to take them to heaven, "Yes, I will take Jacinta and Francisco soon. You are to stay here for some time longer. Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wants to establish devotion in the world to my Immaculate Heart. To those who accept this, I promise the salvation of their souls and they will be loved by God like flowers placed by me to adorn His throne. Lucia inquired sadly: "Am I to stay here alone? "No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God." The Lady opened her hands and for the second time communicated the rays of that same immense light and they saw themselves in that light Jacinta and Francisco in the part that rose toward heaven; Lucia in that which was poured out on the earth. In the Lady's right hand was a heart encircled by thorns that pierced it. They understood this was the Immaculate Heart of Mary, outraged by the sins of humanity and seeking reparation.

The Holm Oak Tree! The holm oak tree on which Our Lady stood was about four feet high at the time of apparitions. Witnesses claimed they could see the leaves of the holm oak become depressed when the children were speaking to the apparition and return to their normal position after it was over. The original tree was stripped bare of its leaves and branches by the pilgrims. Its stump is still preserved beneath the statue of Our Lady at the Shrine of Fatima. Another large holm oak that grows next to the original is today protected by a fence! After the August apparition, Jacinta had cut off the branches of the holm oak where Our Lady had placed her feet. She enthusiastically showed the branches to Lucia's mother. That afternoon the branches disappeared and no one knew what became of them. Shortly before the beatification of shepherds, sister Lucia was handed a case with the relics of the seers, including small particles of Jacinta's holm oak branches. She learned that on August 19, 1917, Jacinta's father hid the branches and kept them always with him until he delivered them to the vice prosecutor for the cause of shepherds.

July Apparition On July 13, the three children arrived at the holm Oak tree. Even more people gathered in the Cova that day. Our Lady said; "I

want you to come here on the 13th of next month and to pray the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only she can help you." Lucia then asked who she was and for a miracle so everyone would believe she was appearing. "Continue to come here every month. In October, I will tell you who I am and what I want, and I will perform a miracle for all to see and believe." And the Lady continued: "sacrifice yourselves for sinners and say many times, especially when you make some sacrifice: O Jesus, it is for love of you, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary."

What is a votive candle? The act of lighting a candle when offering a special prayer has long been a cherished tradition. As a way to help advance the works of the Church and to offer a sacrifice to Christ, it has been customary to give an offering for the candle. The word *votive* comes from the Latin verb *voveo*, meaning *I desire*. It signifies an offering in which a gift is linked with a prayer intention, as a sacrificial dedication of oneself to God, submission to His will, and reliance on His mercy and providence. Essentially, a votive candle is a sentinel that we leave burning heavenward at a sacred place as a visual sign of our prayer of thanks or request.
