PENTECOST SUNDAY

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles (20:16) and St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (16:8). It is the 50th day after Easter (if we count both Easter and Pentecost), and it supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which took place 50 days after the Passover and which celebrated the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai. Christ had promised His Apostles that He would send His Holy Spirit, and, on Pentecost, they were granted the gifts of the Spirit. The Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages. Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated. Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s. Color experts tell us that red is a hot color, best used for fast-paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment, draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

Time for EASTER DUTY is Ending

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty), that is the obligation of receiving the Eucharist for Easter extends to the **Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 27, 2018. No one conscious of committing a serious or mortal sin should receive Holy Communion until they have first gone to the Sacrament of Reconciliation a.k.a. Confession. Confessions are heard EVERY Saturday from 11:00AM to Noon and 3:00-3:30PM, every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning at 7:30AM, as well as every First Friday at 6:30PM, and a Priest is also available to hear Confessions daily by appointment.**

REGISTER FOR OLV PARISH

All Roman Catholics living within the boundaries of Our Lady of Victories Church should officially register; If you did NOT receive an Easter mailing you are probably NOT registered! Obtain a registration form from the priest after Mass or phone Maria at the Rectory. We strongly encourage you to register, even if you do not plan to use envelopes, so we can include you on or mailing list. Only registered members of the parish, who fulfill all other canonical [Church Law] requirements can obtain a Sponsor [Godparent] Certificate, letter of recommendation or other documentation.

JUST A REMINDER

QUESTION

What are the seven deadly sins? They are:

Pride - is the excessive conceit of one's own ability.

Covetousness - is an excessive desire for worldly things.

Lust - is the desire for the sinful pleasures forbidden by the 6th commandment (i.e.) inappropriate sexual desire.

Anger - excessive emotion of hatred against any person or a desire for revenge.

Gluttony - excessive desire for food or drink.

Envy - is the feeling of sorrow at others good fortune, or joy at evil that befalls another individual.

Sloth - is laziness of mind or body.

These sins are the sources of other sins or are the direct cause of other sin.

PENTECOST

The apostles and Mary were locked away in the Upper Room, fearing for their lives, afraid to venture forth, unsure of what God wanted them to do, unable to proclaim the Good News to all the world. They needed help, and they needed it badly. The Son sent the Spirit from the Father! The Father and the Son sent an Advocate, a defense lawyer, who would plead their cause. (The Greek term for Advocate is Parakletos from which we get the term Paraclete.) This Advocate would confirm, guide, lead, remain, and strengthen. Without the Spirit, there could be no Church, since the Spirit binds, enlivens, and infuses the Church with what it needs to live. Once they received the Holy Spirit, they left the Upper Room, and began to preach the faith of the Church: Jesus Christ is Lord.

THE VALUE OF THE MASS

Through Holy Mass you are preserved from many dangers and misfortunes which would otherwise have befallen you. You shorten your Purgatory by every Mass. During Holy Mass you kneel amid a multitude of holy Angels, who are present at the Adorable Sacrifice with reverential awe. Through Holy Mass you are blessed in your temporal goods and affairs. When you hear Holy Mass devoutly, offering it to Almighty God in honor of any particular Saint or Angel, thanking God for the favors bestowed on him, etc., you afford that Saint or Angel a new degree of honor, joy and happiness, and draw his special love and protection on yourself. Every time you assist at Holy Mass, besides other intentions, you should offer it in honor of the Saint of the day. At the hour of your death the Holy Masses you have heard devoutly will be your greatest consolation. Every Mass will go with you to Judgment and will plead for pardon for you. Through the Holy Sacrifice, Our Lord Jesus Christ supplies for many of your negligences and omissions. He forgives you all the venial sins which you are determined to avoid. He forgives you all your unknown sins which you never confessed. The power of Satan over you is diminished. One Holy Mass heard during your life will be of more benefit to you than many heard for you after your death.

Sport at the Service of the Spirit

THE SEVEN GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Down through the ages, the power of the Holy Spirit has been described in many ways. St. Thomas Aquinas formulated and categorized these gifts into what we now call the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Here is a brief description of each gift that we receive at OUR CONFIRMATION:

WISDOM: To see things as they truly are in an open-minded manner.

UNDERSTANDING: A heart that accepts, cares, listens, forgives & understands.

KNOWLEDGE: The ability to comprehend the truths of the universe.

RIGHT JUDGEMENT/COUNCIL: The ability to make good & wise decisions.

COURAGE/FORTITUDE: The strength to do what is right in spite of challenges.

REVERENCE/PIETY: A deep respect for God, for others, & for all creation.

WONDER & AWE in GOD’S PRESENCE/FEAR OF THE LORD:

A sense of the greatness & majesty of God coupled with a deep realization of God’s nearness.

PENTECOST

THE CHURCH’S BIRTHDAY

On Pentecost the Apostles left the Upper Room, the site of the Last Supper, where they had been barricaded for fifty days. (The Greek word, Pentecost, means ‘Fiftieth day’.) For fifty days the Apostles prayed with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and other holy women and men; once they were infused with power from on high, they began what is also called the “Age of the Church”. From Pentecost until the Parousia (The Greek title for the Second Coming of Christ in glory) the work Jesus began during His earthly life will continue through His Body on earth today: the Church. And so Pentecost is rightly called the Church’s birthday.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 11 Orthodox Churches your Church seceded from the Roman Catholic Church in the year 1054.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 20 groups of The Lutheran Synod your sect was founded by Martin Luther in 1517.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 17 groups of The Mennonites your sect was founded by several reformers in 1523.

IF YOU are a member of the Episcopal-Anglican Communion your Church was founded by Thomas Crammer in 1534.

IF YOU are a member of one of the ten groups of The Presbyterians your sect was founded by John Knox in 1560.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 23 branches of The Baptists your sect was founded by John Smyth in 1600.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 19 groups of Methodists your sect was founded by John and Charles Wesley in 1739.

IF YOU are a member of The Disciples of Christ your group was founded by Thomas and Alexander Campbell in 1827.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 7 branches of The Church of Latter Day Saints your religion was founded by Joseph Smith in 1830.

IF YOU are a member of one of the 5 branches of The Seventh Day Adventists your sect was founded by William Miller in 1831.

IF YOU are a member of the Salvation Army your group was founded by William Booth in 1865.

IF YOU are a member of the Jehovah Witnesses your religion was founded by Charles Russell in 1872.

IF YOU are a member of the Church of Christian Scientist your group was founded by Mary Baker Eddy in 1879.

IF YOU are a member of nine groups of The Pentecostal Assemblies your sect was founded by revivalists in 1901,

BUT IF YOU are a member of the Roman Catholic Church, **only you** can trace your Church’s foundation to the disciples and Jesus Christ on Pentecost. It was on this day that the Holy Spirit came down to the 12 disciples to enlighten and empower them to take charge and fulfill the commands of Jesus Christ. The Roman Catholic Church, unlike the 400 or more groups that have broken off from it, remains One in Faith, One in Fold, with One Shepherd.

SIGN OF GLORY

Catholics often make the Sign of the Cross casually, just as a nice gesture for beginning and ending their prayers. But, when we learn to take this act seriously, signing ourselves frequently with faith and reverence, remarkable results can take place. We find ourselves doing measurably better in our Christian life: praying with more passion, resisting our bad inclinations more effectively, and relating to others more kindly. The Sign of the Cross, after all, is not merely a pious gesture. It is a powerful prayer, a sacramental of the Church.
